Participants will receive free medical evaluations by doctors specializing in PKD. Patients also receive free laboratory tests and study blood pressure medications.

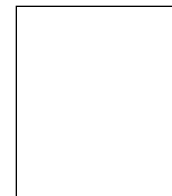

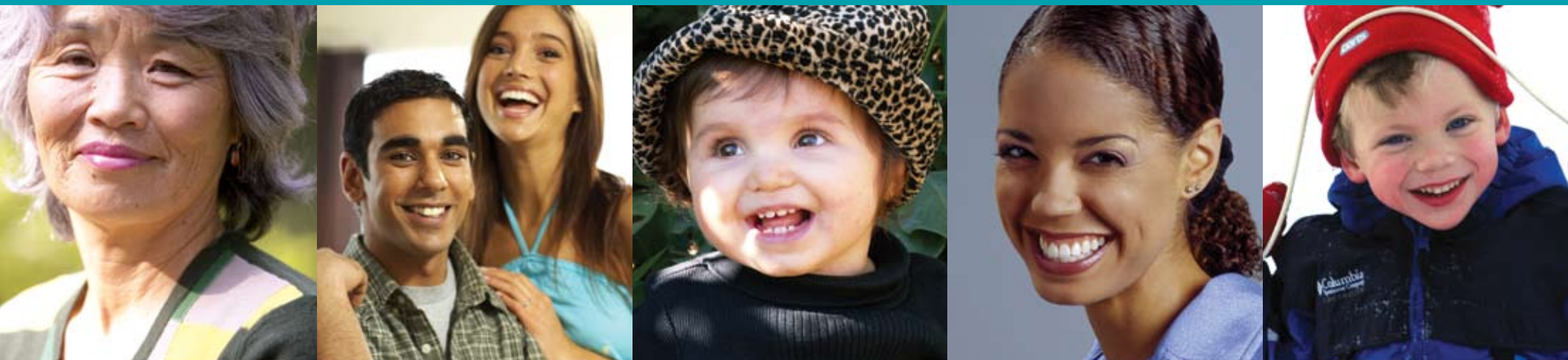
